ADDENDUM 1 – Tier Systems

ENGLAND ONLY

As of 14 October 2020, England will move localised restrictions to a three tier alert system, the idea being that it will streamline and simplify localised restrictions. Each area of England will be placed into one of the three tiers and should follow the guidance as follows:

Tier 1 – Medium	Tier 2 – High	Tier 3 – Very High
<p>National Restrictions apply including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ‘Rule of Six’ indoors and outdoors. • Hospitality curfew of 10pm and table service only. • Work from home if you can. • When travelling, plan ahead or avoid busy times and routes. Walk or cycle if you can. • All other restrictions remain as per the detail within the aide memoire. 	<p>Increased restrictions including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No socialising with anybody outside of your household or support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place. • Rule of six to apply outdoors. • Travel permitted but reduce journeys where possible. 	<p>Further increased restrictions including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No socialising with anybody outside of your household or support bubble indoors or outdoors, although rule of six applies in some public areas such as public parks and beaches. • Pubs and bars must close. They can only remain open where they operate as a restaurant, i.e. serving substantial meals. They may only serve alcohol as part of such a meal. • Wedding ceremonies can go ahead with upto 15 guests but no reception allowed. • Avoid travelling outside or entering a very-high alert level area, other than for things like work, education or youth services, to meet caring responsibilities or if you are travelling through as part of a longer journey. <p>Note: Tier 3 restrictions may be increased beyond the above including the closure of businesses such as; gyms, leisure outlets, tourist attractions etc.</p>
